On April 19 and April 20, Dr. Lai Yu-chih will lead a two-day Masterclass entitled 'Asian Objects and the Museum'. Designed for students with an interest in Asian objects in Dutch collections, this masterclass will take a selected group to Museum Volkenkunde in Leiden and the Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam. The Volkenkunde selection will focus on the collection of Chinese objects assembled by the first Dutch sinologist J.Th. Royer. Participants will work with objects relating to the Asia | China-Europe connections and interactions under the direction of Dr Lai.

The preliminary programme is as follows:

19 April

13.45 meet at entrance Volkenkunde
14.00 object handling and discussion, led by Dr Lai and Dr Jan van Campen, with focus on Chinese objects collected by J. Th. Royer.
16.30 tea and discussion in café
17.00 conclusion of day 1

20 April

13.45 meet at the entrance of Rijksmuseum
14.00 Gallery tour led by Dr Ching-ling Wang, and introduction to specific objects by Professor Lai. Student preferences welcome.
16.30 tea and discussion in Rijksmuseum café
17.00 conclusion of day 2
